MODULE 1.5 TRANSCRIPT

Okay, so at this point, you should have your career map, and you've done all the LinkedIn research.

Alright?

So, the next step is to actually choose the highly targeted job title that you're going to write the résumé for.

Alright?

So, how do you pick one if you're entry-level in your career? You just finished school, and you have little to no experience, so it's actually going to be very easy for you.

You start at the very bottom, like everyone else. You start off with those entry-level job titles that everyone in your industry began with. So that's fairly easy for you.

But what if you're mid-level, alright?

Maybe during your research, the job title you have now is actually somewhere in that list. That's also very easy for you to figure out. If it's on the list, then you know exactly where you stand right now.

But what if you have a job title that isn't necessarily anywhere on this list? I'll be very honest, it's unlikely, but if that happens, you can simply prompt ChatGPT with the following prompt:



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Prompt:

“I’ve created a career map for the job title I want to reach in 10 years. I am currently working as a [insert current job title]. Please:

- 1 Identify which role in this map most closely matches my current level.
- 2 Explain briefly why that role is the best match.
- 3 Tell me which role in the map would logically come next for me.

Here is my career map (paste the career map here).”

And if you want, you can even go a step further and paste in the draft résumé that you already have.

So, we’re writing the résumé, but if you already have one that you think needs improvement, you can also include it in ChatGPT along with the prompt.

Once ChatGPT gives you the closest fit, you’d look at your map to see what comes next, and that’s the role you’ll apply to.

Alright?

The goal of doing it this way is to avoid making lateral moves. You don’t want to make a lateral career change where you’re doing a similar role but not moving up the ladder; you just went horizontal.

If you actually follow the career map, then after that job, you’ll also go up one more step. Don’t go horizontal.

Now, what if you want to make a career transition?

What if it’s not so straightforward?



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What if you're changing to a brand-new career entirely, or switching industries?

So, let's say you're staying in the same career but moving to a different industry. This often applies to fields like Accounting.

Accounting can work in any industry; accounting is accounting. There's legal, there's engineering, but it's still a transition into a new industry, and each industry does things differently. There's a different network, different jargon and lingo entirely, and even different software. So, there's a gap.

How do you do that?

Here's my solution because you're not getting one-on-one advice from me; you're taking a course. So, we're going to use ChatGPT to help you figure that out.

You can simply prompt ChatGPT again with this:

Prompt:

"I've created a career map for the job title I want to reach in 10 years. I am currently working as a [insert your current job title and industry]. I want to transition into a new career or industry. Please:

- 1 Identify which role in my career map is the best entry point for this transition.
- 2 Explain why this role is a good fit based on my background and transferable skills.
- 3 Suggest what I should highlight in my résumé to make myself competitive for this role.

Here is my career map (paste the career map here).

Here is my current résumé (paste the draft résumé you wrote before taking this course)."

Once you have your **targeted job title**, it's time to move on to the next stage, actually writing your résumé.

So finally, we're getting into what you came here for.
